

It is my privilege to write to you from this desk as we near 34 years of our existence in creating meaningful impact for the most vulnerable, marginalised and under privileged communities of our country.

The year 2023-24 has been a period of much reflection, dialogues and meaningful action by keeping community at the centre.

During this period, we refocused on our strategies and expertise, emphasized and refreshed the core values that define who we are and doubled down on our core values of empathy, integrity, quality, equity and inclusiveness. The achievements of last year have inspired us to look closely at what brought about the changes and how to sustain them for the generations to come. The learnings helped us to reflect and build a stronger and more resilient future with powerful approach for better outcome of our initiatives.

The achievements were visible across thematic areas of our strategic priorities. We have impacted **2,04,667** lives in last financial year. Our Child protection initiative reached **22,226**, Health, nutrition and well-being program reached **1,63,438** and our adolescent and youth empowerment vertical reached **19,003**.

Last year has witnessed few path breaking initiatives and success stories across the program, finance and compliance of CCDT. We have successfully implemented "Community Led Child Protection" initiatives by forming ward and village level child protection committees involving community and government stakeholders in making the communities safer for their children and adolescents. Our "Adolescent Empowerment Program" introduced coding skills for under privileged school going children and broke many glass ceilings including challenging the gender norms of the society. We have successfully converted our "Ankur- Residential care program" for adolescent girls into a ecofriendly centre by installing solar panels, planting trees and by reducing plastic use. We are proud to share that CCDT has received the "Bal Snehi" award from Maharashtra State Child Rights Commission. We have been certified as "Great Place To Work" and also, we are now registered with "Social Stock Exchange".

Thank you everyone for adding value to our programs and reposing your trust in us. Because of your continued support and passion to the cause we are inching forward to a more equitable world. We look forward to cocreate more sustainable programs for a better world of opportunities for the under privileged communities in years to come.



SAFEGUARDING FUTURES

PROGRAMS UNDER THIS INITIATIVE

RESIDENTIAL CARE PROGRAM (SHELTER HOMES)

Our Residential Care Program, comprising Ashray in Bandra and Ankur-Asmita in Badlapur, offers holistic care and protection to children affected by HIV/AIDS and those facing crises. These shelters are like home away from home where children are nurtured and empowered, fostering their journey towards reintegration or self-reliance. Our initiatives epitomise our unwavering dedication to protecting childhood and safeguarding futures. Through our collective efforts, we strive to create a world where every child can thrive, regardless of circumstance.

COMMUNITY LED CHILD PROTECTION

Children, often unable to defend themselves, find protection through vigilant community members who understand local risks and can swiftly respond to threats. In Ganpat Patil Nagar (Mumbai's largest slums in the western suburbs), where basic amenities are scarce and crime rates are high, children and pregnant women are particularly vulnerable. Our initiative empowers children to become advocates and establishes local committees to ensure their safety. With a surge in crimes against children nationwide, our mission is clear: empower communities to prevent and protect. Together, we create safe space and foster a collective commitment to securing a brighter future for every child.

CCDT'S JOURNEY IN MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

Celebrating over three decades of involvement, Committed Communities Development Trust (CCDT) has been steadfast in its mission to uplift communities through comprehensive Health and Well Being initiatives. At the heart of CCDT's efforts lies a commitment to empowering women, children, and adolescents with access to essential healthcare services, ensuring healthier lives and brighter futures. This initiative strongly aligns with Sustainable Development Goal 3: Good Health and Well-being, aiming to promote well-being for all at all ages, and reduce maternal, child morbidity and mortality through targeted healthcare interventions.



PROGRAMS UNDER THIS INITIATIVE

SURAKSHA

Operating in Bhiwandi (Thane) and Malegaon (Nashik), Project Suraksha improves healthcare-seeking behavior among mothers and communities, aiming to reduce infant and maternal morbidity and mortality through awareness, education and advocacy.

HAMSAB

HAMSAB aims to enhance the first 1000 days of a child's life in Alonde and Moh, Vikramgad tehsil, Palghar district. This project focuses on improving child survival and cognitive development through antenatal and postnatal care, institutional deliveries, nutritional support and using technology to improve quality care for pregnant women.

INTEGRATED VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The program addresses health and education challenges in Khand village, Vikramgad tehsil. This project aims to improve health services through referrals, enhance educational opportunities, and strengthen linkages with government facilities. Key focus areas include health, child protection, schooling and social entitlements.

CCDT'S PROGRAM FOR ADOLESCENTS AND YOUTH

CCDT's initiatives aimed at supporting adolescents and youth in Mumbai and Thane, through targeted programs designed to address pressing post-pandemic challenges, exemplify its commitment to community upliftment. Pehel and the Youth Skill Building Program are pivotal in enhancing the resilience and opportunities for underprivileged youth in these urban communities. These programs focus on critical areas such as education, vocational skills, health, and social development, aiming to foster sustainable empowerment and community upliftment.

These initiatives are aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 4 & 8: providing opportunities for adolescents' health and well-being, build skills and contribute positively to their communities.



PROGRAMS UNDER THIS INITIATIVE

PEHEL

The CCDT intervention in Mumbai focuses on empowering adolescents aged 10-19 by addressing sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR). The project aims to improve knowledge, provide life skills, and build safe spaces for marginalized adolescents and their families, enhancing self-protection and community engagement.

YOUTH SKILL BUILDING PROGRAM

CCDT's Youth Skill Building Program targets individuals aged 18-29 from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. This initiative focuses on equipping youth with job-oriented vocational skills to enhance their employability and economic independence. By providing practical training and support, the program empowers young adults to pursue meaningful career paths and contribute positively to their families and communities.

SKILL & CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Designed to empower first-generation adolescent learners from underprivileged communities in Mumbai. Focused on fostering IT awareness and basic coding skills, the program equips students with fundamental computer knowledge essential for pursuing careers in technology. By enhancing their educational aspirations and career awareness, we aim to prepare students to confidently navigate the evolving technological landscape, enabling them to design their own websites and adapt to market demands. This initiative not only builds technical skills but also empowers youth to make informed education and career decisions, ensuring a path to sustainable empowerment.

RITIKA'S JOURNEY TO SUCCESS

TALE OF EMPOWERED DREAMS

Meet Ritika Singh, a determined 19-year-old from a lower-middle-class family in Mumbai. With her father as the sole provider and three siblings to support, financial constraints initially hindered Ritika's dream of a career in banking. After completing her 12th standard, she worked in various low-paying jobs until she discovered CCDT's Youth Empowerment Program- AAROHAN.

Enrolling in the program, Ritika underwent rigorous training that not only boosted her confidence in public speaking but also equipped her with essential skills for the BPO and retail industries, financial literacy, and advanced computer proficiency. Armed with newfound knowledge, Ritika secured a job at ICICI Lombard as a Tele-sales executive, earning INR 14,000 per month.

Her dedication and skills soon earned her a promotion to Relationship Manager at Andromeda, India's largest loan distributor, where she now earns INR 25,900 plus incentives per month. Today, Ritika is financially independent, supports her family, and dreams of advancing to a management role within the next five years at Andromeda.

Ritika attributes her success to the training and placement support provided by CCDT AAROHAN, expressing heartfelt gratitude for the opportunity that has transformed her life.



SAIMA'S WELL BEING

EMPOWERING MATERNAL HEALTH

Diagnosed as pregnant during a new ANC screening visit, found to be in her 5th month of pregnancy with anemia (Hemoglobin level: 6 g/dl). Registered under the Suraksha Project in September 2023.

Mrs. Saima Khan, previously reliant on childbirth at home, was identified as a high-risk mother. Through dedicated counselling, she and her family agreed to opt for institutional delivery, resulting in the birth of a healthy child.

Continuous education and counseling empowered Saima and her family to understand the risks of childbirth at home and embrace family planning, leading to their improved well-being.

MCZMA recommends approval for bridge project, stresses on green measures
The Maharashtra Coastal Zone Management Authority (MCZMA) has granted crucial clearance for the Goregaon Creek bridge project, a landmark development for the region. The authority, which regulates coastal zone activities, has approved the project after a thorough review of the environmental impact assessment (EIA) and the project's compliance with the Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) norms. The bridge, which will span the Goregaon Creek, is a vital link between the two parts of the suburb, significantly reducing travel time and easing traffic congestion. The project is being implemented by the Goregaon Creek Bridge Trust, a non-profit organization dedicated to the development of the area. The MCZMA's approval is a significant step towards the project's completion, which is expected to be completed by the end of the year. The bridge will not only improve connectivity but also enhance the quality of life for the residents of Goregaon. The project is a testament to the commitment of the Goregaon Creek Bridge Trust and the support of the local community and the government.
